Uterine cancer usually begins in the endometrium, the lining of the womb. Most cases of uterine cancer develop in postmenopausal women whose period has stopped. However, it can also affect women younger than 40 years old.

## **Signs and Symptoms**

- Post-menopausal bleeding
  - Irregular heavy menses
  - Intermenstrual spotting
    - Prolonged spotting
- Pink, watery or white discharge from vagina
  - Pelvic pain
  - Pain during intercourse
    - Weight loss
